1941-1943

Under Mr. Warren Bowers' principalship, the school paper was again published, using the name, "The Spring Garden Scholastic." Pete Bryant was the editor. Mr. Bowers prepared soup occasionally and sold it to the students for lunch.

The FFA boys, under the supervision of Mr. J. T. W. Mitchell, advisor, built the two backboards and put up the goals in the auditorium so the basketball teams could move indoors.

Excavation was begun under the auditorium, and a cannery was installed. Funds for the purchase of equipment were furnished by the Defense Program.

1943-1945

In 1943, Mrs. Anna Cox took charge of the soup kitchen but soon changed it into a cafeteria, serving soup two days and plate lunches three days a week. A little later, soup was served only one day. Mrs. Cox has continued serving as cafeteria supervisor until the present. In 1944 another teacher was added to the faculty.
